Updates to Online Resources on Egyptology

From UCLA

The website for the Virtual Reality model presented at ARCE OC this past year is now up online! The Digital Karnak Project is pleased to announce the launch of its website: http://dlib.etc.ucla.edu/projects/Karnak/. The Digital Karnak Project, based at the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA), aims to make the ancient Egyptian site of Karnak more accessible

The website features a geographically-referenced "time-map" highlighting the areas of the temple under construction during the reign of each Egyptian king, thematic videos of a 3D Virtual Reality model of the temple along with corresponding instructional texts, individual descriptions of each temple building recreated on the Virtual Reality model and a fully interactive Google Earth version of the model.

The Digital Karnak Project website is best viewed using Mozilla Firefox 2 (PC and Mac), Internet Explorer 7 (PC), and Safari 3 (Mac).

The Digital Karnak Project is funded by the National Endowment of the Humanities (NEH) and the Steinmetz Family Trust. The project was made possible through UCLA's Institute for Digital Research and Education (IDRE). Directors are UCLA professors Dr. Diane Favro and Dr. Willeke Wendrich.

From Dr. Kent Weeks in Luxor:

www.thebanmappingproject.com, the most popular archaeological website, visited by millions each year, has just been updated to include:

- An updated progress report on KV5, including 19th Dynasty graffiti
- A 5,000 entry bibliography on Theban sites, covering all written materials from 1760 to now.
- A copy of the site management plan for the Valley of the Kings, the first of its kind.
- Over 4,000 color photographs of tomb decorations. All can be zoomed down to the brush stroke level, and correlated with maps to show their location.
- A report on the Valley of the Kings Visitor Center, for which the TMP designed exhibits.

Upcoming projects include a tomb atlas for the Valley of the Queens, a pilot project for tomb lighting for the VOK, and further excavation of the latest huge burial chamber in KV5.

From the Petrie Museum in London:

Sir Flinders Petrie, one of the premier Egyptologists of his era, was able to transport many small objects home to found an amazing museum in London. The Petrie has digitized most of its collection, which you may visit at: www.petrie.ucl.ac.uk/index2.html. Another 3,000 pages can be accessed at http://www.digitalegypt.ucl.ac.uk/. Yes, that is 3000 pages!
